## **Authority:**

Resolved that the authority of the '2020 Queensland Circuit Racing State Championships Sporting Regulations ver 2', be confirmed and that the document authority be identified as '2020 Queensland Circuit Racing State Championships Sporting Regulations ver 2 - QSC 20.0066

Held in accordance with the International Sporting Code of the FIA and the National Competition Rules (NCR) of Motorsport Australia.

# 1: Championship Regulations:

- 1.01 Should State Championship races be conducted at National Championship meetings the races must comply with these Regulations. Exceptions will be at the discretion of the Queensland State Council.
- 1.02 There will be at least one Championship race conducted at each race meeting for each category participating at that meeting and conforming to the minimum entry requirements.
- 1.03 Championship-races will be of a minimum aggregate race distance of 60km. Individual categories may specify varying race durations within this overall total distance.
- 1.04 To qualify as a 'Championship Round' there must be a minimum of six (6) bona fide entries, who participate in a part of the meeting for the category for which the round is being conducted. When a race is conducted for a category concurrent with another category, the status of 'Championship Round' will only apply to the category/s having a minimum of six (6) bona fide entries for that category.
- 1.05 All rounds will count unless noted otherwise.
- 1.06 Entries may be invited by meeting promoters from competitors in all categories listed in these regulations at each Championship round.
- 1.07 Invited non-championship categories may participate at State Championship race meetings.

# 2: Point Score:

2.01 For all categories, points will be awarded as follows to outright placegetters in each race:

- 2.02 One (1) point shall be awarded for fastest lap in each championship race.
- 2.03 One (1) point shall be awarded to the competitor achieving pole position in qualifying for the first championship race at each meeting.
- 2.04 The competitor achieving the highest number of points accrued in the championship/series rounds for the category will win the championship for that category. However, if two or more competitors achieve the same number of points, the winner will be:
  - a) The competitor who achieves the greatest number of 1st places.
  - b) If the number of 1st place achievements is the same, the competitor who achieves the greatest number of 2nd places.





c) If the number of 2<sup>nd</sup> place achievements is the same, the competitor who achieves the greatest number of 3<sup>rd</sup> places, and so on until a winner emerges.

## 3: 2020 Queensland Circuit Racing State Championship Categories:

1st Category Cars (excluding Formula Ford 1600 and Formula Vee)

5th Category Racing & Sports Cars – Groups M, O, P, Q and R

2<sup>nd</sup> Category Group 2A (excluding vehicles on 2B/2F eligibility lists) and Group 2C Supersports

6th Category Group 6SR

Includes: 5th Category Formula Ford Group Fa, Fb & Fc

# 1<sup>st</sup> Category Racing Cars – Formula Vee

A race may be conducted for suitable combinations of the above categories at the promoter's discretion where individual category entries are low or on the basis of safety. (Points will still be awarded for each individual category provided the minimum entry requirements are met.)





## 4: 2020 Queensland Circuit Racing State Championship Event Schedule:

- 4.1 The 2020 Queensland Circuit Racing State Championships will be conducted over the following four (4) race meetings at Morgan Park Raceway, Warwick.
- 4.2 At each meeting, races may be conducted for all categories listed at page 3 of these Sporting Regulations, subject to the criteria for minimum entry levels being met.

- 4.3 If, with the approval of Motorsport Australia, a lesser number of meetings are conducted, then those meetings will be the Championship.
- 4.4 Due to Coronavirus restrictions, the 2020 Queensland Circuit Racing State Championships will be limited to two (2) race meetings as shown at 4.2.

- 5.2 Point scores will be available from the Motorsport Australia website at <a href="https://motorsport.org.au/regulations/sporting-technical/queensland">https://motorsport.org.au/regulations/sporting-technical/queensland</a>, and also from the web site of each of the race meeting organisers.

#### 6: Grid Positions & Start Procedure:

- 6.1 For all categories:
- 6.1.1 For championship/series race 1 at each meeting, grid positions will be decided on lap times established in nominated qualifying sessions with the fastest driver being placed on pole position and the remainder in order of their qualifying times. Drivers that fail to qualify may be permitted to start their first race from the rear of grid, subject to the provisions of the Race Meeting Standing Regulations.
- 6.1.2 For subsequent championship races at each meeting, grid positions will be decided by the finishing order of the preceding championship race, followed by the non-finishers in the order of the number of laps completed in the preceding race as published in the race results, followed by the non-starters of the preceding race.
- 6.2 Each race for the Sports Sedan, Trans Am, Prodsport and Superkart categories will be conducted from a rolling start.
- 6.2.1 Each other category race will be from a standing start. Starting procedures will be in accordance with CAMS Race Meeting Standing Regulations. Any variation to the type of start will be notified in the meeting Supplementary Regulations.
- 6.3 The penalty for a false start will be in accordance with the Race Meeting Standing Regulations.

# 7: <u>In-Car Video footage:</u>

The memory card containing any in-car footage recorded must be provided upon request to the Clerk of Course, or their appointee or Stewards of the Meeting without delay. Such footage may be used by said Officials to assist with their determination of incidents or events.





## 8: Safety Car:

The Safety Car may be brought into operation to neutralise a race upon the decision of the Clerk of Course in accordance with the Race Meeting Standing Regulations.

Each lap conducted while the Safety Car is in operation will be counted as a race lap.
